Academic Job Market Summer Camp 2025 Executive Summary

UChicagoGRAD helped **168** graduate students and postdocs prepare for the academic job market and connect with alumni in faculty roles at its weeklong **Academic Job Market Summer Camp**, held from July 14-18, 2025. During 18 sessions across 5 days, the camp provided actionable advice on all application documents and position types. UChicagoGRAD staff facilitated the camp in partnership with offices across campus, including the Chicago Center for Teaching and Learning, Academic Technology Services, and the Office of International Affairs. Moreover, the camp highlighted the experience and expertise of **17 alumni panelists and three UChicago faculty moderators and panelists**, who provided attendees with practical advice on successfully applying for faculty positions at a range of institutions.
