

Grant Writing for Nonprofits

PATHS Seminar



Do you want to improve your ability to secure funding and advance the mission of nonprofits?

This 3-week online PATHS course will introduce participants to the basic skills needed to write grants in support of nonprofits. Through hands-on activities, attendees will collaborate to develop an entry-level grant proposal, learning how to assess organizational capacity and write with a budget in mind. Participants will gain an understanding of the similarities and differences between writing academic research grants and writing grants for nonprofits. They will also receive advice for launching a career in this field.

The course will be taught by Larry Pande, Deputy Director of Organizational Management & Growth at Beyond Legal Aid. Larry has successfully obtained \$4M+ from writing federal, state, and foundation grants and recently secured state funding to expand legal services to communities impacted by immigration policies and incarceration. Prior to entering the nonprofit field, Larry served as the lead proposal writer at a consulting firm, drafting multi-billion-dollar proposals. In 2013 he earned his MA in Middle Eastern Studies at UChicago, where he received a Foreign Language Area Studies award.
