Understanding Performance Curation

Have you ever wondered how a performance program comes into fruition? In this short course, Sarah Curran, Consulting Curator for the Experimental Performance Initiative at UChicago, will offer an overview of the field of performance curation, the role of the curator, and the skills needed to support performing artists.

This workshop will guide you through the process of creating an initial idea, developing a curatorial statement, gathering financial support, and drawing an audience. Conversations with artists will illuminate how curators interact with practitioners and cultivate a platform within the art community. 
